### **Explanatory Note for the Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) Report August 1, 2011**

This transmits the FWS's National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) compliance report for projects and activities funded under Section 1609 (c) of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009. The Excel reporting template provides the most current information on the NEPA compliance status for all FWS ARRA projects and activities identified or selected through June 30, 2011.

The total number of FWS ARRA NEPA projects remains at 713. There were no new projects added this quarter. NEPA compliance has been completed for all 713 FWS ARRA funded projects (1,055 total NEPA actions). As explained in previous reports, some ARRA projects are defined broadly and therefore they can be broken down into sub-projects that have independent utility and are individually analyzed under NEPA. This can result in a higher number of NEPA actions per ARRA project.

#### **Pending Federal Environmental Reviews & Documents (p.2 - Column J)**

Federal requirements remain pending for the following FWS ARRA projects: R4AF (row 257); R4TA (row 403); R4UB (row 408); R4UC (row 409); and R4UD (row 410). We are continuing to make progress toward completing all Federal environmental reviews for these projects.

#### **Status of FWS ARRA Funding Obligations**

- As of September 30, 2010 the Service obligated 100% of the \$280 million awarded in Recovery Act funding. The Service's obligations have fluctuated slightly due to various reasons, mainly surrounding the completion of projects (e.g., projects completed under budget). Note that increases in obligations are consistent with the Department's Recovery Act guidance for use of expired appropriations for upward obligation adjustments. The appropriation totals have not changed.
- As of June 30, 2011 the Service has outlayed \$217,396,673, or 81.5% of Recovery Act project funding.
